GREETING AND EXPLANATION OF THE SERVICE

The Good Friday service is intended to be a Solemn Assembly. In the Old Testament Solemn Assemblies were used as a gathering for the people to cry out to God. We take this opportunity today to remember Christ's death on the cross for our sin and for our salvation. This is a time for personal reflection, contemplation, and prayer. We will reflect on the 7 last statements of Christ. Each reading will be followed by a hymn to be sung or a musical offering to allow for contemplation.

Let's prepare our hearts for worship:

Unison Prayer: O God of love and power, we enter this time of worship on Good Friday to reflect on Christ our Savior. We reflect on the great price He paid. We are humbled in the presence of such love and mercy. Open our hearts to your goodness, fill us with your love and the power of your Holy Spirit. Forgive us our sins and remind us that you have defeated death and that through your sacrifice we have everlasting life.

1. "Father Forgive Them" Luke 23:33–34 (ESV)

³³And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments.

²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" ²⁷Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.
